



Covid-19 Guidelines for Wildcats & Mini Soccer & Mini Soccer Sessions

Before and Arrival at Wildcats & Mini Soccer & Mini Soccer

- If a Player or Parent is showing symptoms of Covid-19, they MUST NOT attend Wildcats or Mini Soccer & Mini Soccer. Symptoms can include
 - High Temperature (37.8 or More)
 - New Continuous cough
 - Loss of Taste and/or smell
- **The Self Assessment Checklist MUST be completed before players and parents attend Wildcats or Mini Soccer & Mini Soccer. Checklists will have been sent to all parents. The Track and Trace register, to confirm the checks have been completed must be signed for all those attending Wildcats or Mini Soccer. Players will not be able to participate if the register has not been signed**
- Please arrive for Wildcats or Mini Soccer promptly, we will not be able to start a session until all players have arrived
- If you will not be able to attend Wildcats or Mini Soccer, please give me as much notice as possible by emailing

- One parent per family to take player to Wildcats or Mini Soccer and remain together and keep social distancing from other players, parents and coaches until training starts.
- Players must only travel in their own family group and stay 2 metres apart if arriving to Wildcats or Mini Soccer at the same time as other players or coaches.
- A parent must remain at Wildcats or Mini Soccer at all times and be visible at all times, maintaining social distancing.
- Each player should bring their own water bottle and must not share with anyone else.
- **Parents/players should bring their own sanitiser.**
- Toilets will not be open. Parents will need to take players home to use their toilets, they can return afterwards.
- Players should be informed that spitting should be avoided.

Wildcats & Mini Soccer Session

- Players should sanitise their hands before starting training.
- Players should remain with their parent until asked to join the session.
- Each player will have a marked cone. They should leave their drink bottle at the cone and return to it after each activity
- Each session will last a maximum of 60 minutes.
- The sharing of equipment is not allowed, and the touching of equipment should be kept to a minimum. If a player or coach loses control of the ball it should be passed back or collected keeping social distancing.
- Players will not rotate with other sessions on the same day.

Leaving Wildcats & Mini Soccer

- Players will be dismissed to parents one by one.
- Players should sanitise their hands when leaving Wildcats or Mini Soccer.
- Please leave immediately following social distancing.
- All litter and waste products must be put in appropriate bin bags and removed at the end of each session, individuals are responsible for bagging and removing their own waste.
