| Purpose | By completing the Medical Emergency Action Plan, our club has demonstrated an effective medical response plan in the event of a player, coach, member of public, match official or spectator being injured or becoming seriously ill whilst on site(s) or hired pitches for the purposes of football activities. |
| | The club and representatives have made suitable arrangements and taken all reasonable steps to handle foreseeable medical emergency situations to support as required. |
| | All of our Mini Soccer, Youth, Colts teams, Pumas and Wildcats Coaches/Managers are FA Emergency First Aid Trained and on match days there is always a provision of a minimum of 1 trained FA person per team available to support with a serious incident on any given match day. |

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In the event of medical emergency either injury / ill health incident before / during or after football activity, follow this procedure:-

Procedure

- 1.0 Grab and go grab the first aid kit / water / sponge and get on/around the pitch
- 2.0 Slow down as you approach the casualty (do not trip/slip and land on them)
- 3.0 Follow your First Aid Training:
 - Conduct Primary Survey (DR ABCDE Danger, Response, Airway, Breathing & Circulation, Dysfunction & Everything Else
- 4.0 If it starts going wrong, call for help, ask others to help manage the scene Emergency Telephone Numbers: **999** or **112**. The operator will triage the call and decide appropriate action from there.

What Three Words – App – for locating our pitches / AED

- 1) Priory Park Pitch views.painting.series
- 2) <u>Defibrillator (AED) Location Side of Pavilion building</u>

If the Emergency operator decides to send out an ambulance to the pitch:-

Send someone out to the road to direct the ambulance through to the pitches and open the gate. Always send someone else to get key to open gate to Main Field. Ensure there are no obstructions in front of gate.

All coaches issued with Key for emergency access gate onto the field

In the event that the ambulance wants access to the playing surface, then when entering the ground the ambulance is to continue up to playing field gate where there is a "Strictly No Parking" area to allow access to pitches

Check the ground conditions, especially in winter, so the ambulance can get safely off the pitches

5.0 **Incident Reporting.** After dealing with the casualty, once the situation is under control, make an entry/record of the incident in your notes about the incident.

(Tip: Use your note or voice-recorder on your mobile phone to note the facts straight after the game/injury so you can recall them later)

6.0 **Follow up actions.** Re-stock first aid kit as necessary and seek support if required for any traumatic injuries dealt with

In the event of Minor Injury / illness before, during or after football activity, follow this procedure:-

Procedure

After the game if you gave any first aid for any minor injuries that occurred, follow this procedure:-

- 1.0 Check the player is still feeling OK once play has finished
- 2.0 Inform the parents verbally. Let them know what happened and what treatment you gave (if any). If you forget during the session, follow up with a text message after the activity
- 2.0 Incident Reporting. Make an entry/record of the incident in your notes

(Tip: Use your note or voice-recorder on your mobile phone to note the facts straight after the game/injury so you can recall them later)

- 3.0 **Follow up actions**. Re-stock your first aid kit as necessary or report first aid stock shortages to club at earliest opportunity.
- 4.0 Report any welfare or safety concerns to CWO.
